### MN Job Skills Partnership Overview:

### Partnership Program:

Act as a catalyst to bring employers with specific training needs together with educational institutions that can design programs to meet those needs.

Provide workers with skills businesses need to compete

Develop capacity in our training institutions Provide training that offers longterm professional growth and economic opportunity for workers




#### Partnership Program:

- Grants of up to \$400,000
- Develop and deliver customized training specific to the business's needs
- 1:1 business match requirement
- Grants average \$1,200 per worker trained
- Training for new and/or incumbent workers
- Projects range 1-3 years



### Partnership Program:

- 61% of grants to the manufacturing industry
- Training trends related to:
  - Succession Planning
  - Emerging Technology/ Automation
  - Worker Shortages





## Partnership Program Process:

- Partner with an accredited educational institution
- Determine training needs, develop training plan and budget
- Educational institution does the bulk of the grant writing



#### Partnership Program Process:

- Submit grant application to MJSP
- MJSP staff reviews and scores grant applications and writes funding recommendations for MJSP board
- MJSP board meets to make funding decisions



## **Reporting Requirements:**

- Educational institution responsible for most reporting
- Business is responsible for:
  - Tracking and reporting matching contributions
  - Providing information on trainees
  - Progress report every 8 months
  - Final project evaluation



### Job Training Incentive Program:

Provide grants to new or expanding businesses for the purpose of training new workers as quickly and efficiently as possible.

- Grants of up to \$200,000 to businesses located in Greater MN
- \$5,000-\$9,000 per new job
- Business must match the grant .5:1
- \$500 application fee
- New jobs must pay wages at least equal to median hourly wage of the county in which the jobs are located



## Job Training Incentive Program:

- Projects typically run one year
- Training provider: educational institution, consultant, equipment vendor, in-house, etc.
- Grant funds used for direct training costs
- Awarded on first-come, first-serve basis by Commissioner of DEED
- Progress reports every 6 months
- Final report, request for reimbursement and payroll report due at end



# Automation Training Incentive Program:

Contingent on legislation being enacted, will provide training grants to assist small businesses located in Greater MN in the adoption of new automation technology.

- Grants of up to \$35,000 to businesses with 150 or fewer employees
- Jobs must pay wages of at least 120% of federal poverty guidelines for a family of four
- Grant funds are used to pay direct training costs
- Awards made on a first-come, first-serve basis by Commissioner of DEED
- Reporting requirements similar to JTIP
